
All the sessions will take place in the Tomás Villarroya Room, 1<sup>st</sup> Floor (in front of Corridor E), in the Faculty of Law Building.

### ACCOMODATION

#### **HOW TO GET THERE?**

All the participants are arriving from the Manises airport in Valencia. There are two ways of reaching the Facultuy of Law and the Residence:

a/ Take a taxi and ask for the "Residence Damia Bonet en Calle Serpis", going through "the rondas" (if you are asked which way to choose). It will cost around 25 euros. The travel takes 25-30 minutes around.

b/ Take the Metro inside the airport (Red Line 3), and go until BENIMACLET. There you must go upstairs to take a connection with the Blue or Purple Lines (4 or 6) going direction to DR. LLUCH The final stop is LA CARRASCA, the third after BENIMACLET. There you will be in front of the Faculty of Law and 10 minutes to the residence.
